Bigstone Cree Nation Athletic Pavilion Wabasca, Alberta 140' wide x 175' long

When the Bigstone Cree Nation Education Authority launched its plan to build a new, state-of-the-art high school, members determined that constructing a separate building to serve as the school's gymnasium would be a cost-effective move. Wanting a high-performing, energy-efficient structure that could be built much faster than a conventional gym facility, they turned to Sprung for a solution.

Sprung designed and delivered a fully insulated structure that houses a top-of-the-line running track, workout areas, two high-definition screens, and a hardwood basketball court featuring the nation's logo in the center. To maximize efficiency, the building also features a dividing curtain that allows for simultaneous activities or PE classes, as well as a locker rooms, offices, and separate entrances for after-school activities.

Enoch Cree Nation Powwow Pavilion Central Alberta 150' radius

Remembering Sprung's long-term quality and service from a project completed for them in the early 1990s, the Enoch Cree Nation once again chose to work with Sprung—this time on a customized structure for its annual powwow, which would host approximately 1,800 people.

Sprung designed and delivered an attractive, highly durable structure built to resemble a teepee. Showcasing the nation's tribal colors (white and blue) on its exterior membrane, the round structure also features a cost-effective earth-anchoring system and a 9000 CFM ventilation unit in its peak to dissipate heat.

This Sprung solution provided the Enoch Cree Nation with a unique powwow experience, as members were able to celebrate on the grass, one with the Earth yet protected from the elements.

Kainai Multi-Purpose Centre Southern Alberta 130' wide x 290' long

Based primarily in Southern Alberta, the Blood Tribe (or Kainai Nation) has more than 12,000 members, many of whom reside on the nation's primary reserve, which is the largest First Nations reserve in Canada.

In the face of rising health and wellness issues within its community, the Blood Tribe decided to build a multi-purpose recreation facility to inspire active living and connection.

Within a few short months, a fully insulated Sprung structure was erected to accommodate a wide range of needs and applications. The structure features a 12,000-square-foot gymnasium, weight room, running track and change rooms, as well as administration space, centers for both Elders and youth, a nutrition center and an Indigenous library.
